During data migration they found a combination of legacy database inability to export clean data and years of data entry errors due to lack of data validation in the legacy system. Along with UAT which helped ADG I.D. several improvements and many of them were not in the original business requirements or contradicted initial instructions. These have impacted End Date, Scope and Budget for the project a change request has been submitted for ITAC review and approval.

## Date/high-level overview of the approved original project investment justification (PIJ):

On October 20, 2021, ADOA ASET approved the original project investment justification (PIJ) to procure the Salesforce E-licensing solution.

#### This solution:

- Will be used to streamline gaming certifications (employee and vendor)
- Is a custom Salesforce application
- Is CJIS Compliant
- Provides secure portals that streamline authorizations, payments, and on demand document and information sharing between ADG, Tribal Gaming Offices, and applicants
- Eliminates data entry by using online applications that flow directly into our licensing system
- Is a step toward Gaming retiring antiquated legacy database systems

After vetting numerous Salesforce Integrators, MTX was selected to create our e-licensing platform.

The original PIJ spanned 12 weeks and had development costs of \$1,231,371.

## Project Change Request Overview



### What in the PIJ is changing?:

- √ Timeline
  - From 12 weeks to 18 weeks
- ✓ Scope
- Descoping DocuSign integration, and Adding DrawLoop integration, In-person training, significant data cleanup, and several system enhancements identified during UAT.
- ✓ Budget
  - From \$1,231,371 to \$1,464,079 (difference is \$232,708 or 18.9% of orig. development)

### What initiated this change?:

- DrawLoop instead of DocuSign: Post Go-Live Customizability and CJIS compliance
- In-person training: Request from Deputy Director due to concerns with remote training
- **Data Cleanup:** A combination of legacy database inability to export clean data and years of data entry errors due to lack of data validation in legacy system.
- **System Enhancements:** UAT helped ADG I.D. several improvements and many of them were not in the original business requirements or contradicted initial instructions.


